

Activities & Achievements of Cooperatives in Jharkhand

Activities Financial Services through State Cooperative Bank and LAMPS/ **PACS** Infrastructure Development 3 **Enabling Technology Services**

Achievements

- Providing short & medium term loans for agricultural activities, infrastructure development, allied activities, etc
- Rs. 2033.76 crore deposits at State Cooperative Banks
- Rs. 12.01 crore KCC loan sanctioned
- KCC to LAMPS/ PACS members
- 1434 LAMPS/PACS linked with Cooperative Bank
- Under working capital support activity, 432 LAMPS/PACS were provided Rs 2 lakh each as working capital
- Rs. 21 crore will be given to nodal LAMPS/PACS for procuring seeds, fertilizer etc
- 1339 LAPMS/PACS have been provided with storage facilities with total capacity of 1.46 lakh MT.
- For cold chain infrastructure 19 cold storages of 5000 MT and 139 cold rooms of 30 MT developed
- 32 solar based cold rooms constructed for fruits and vegetables
- LAMPS/ PACS working as Common Services Centre (CSC) and Banking Correspondents
- 934 LAMPS/ PACS were computerized and 573 LAMPS/ PACS developed as Pragya Kendras (CSCs)
- Under EoDB now registration of new LAMPS/ PACS is being online
- Procurement at Minimum Support
 Price
- Purchasing paddy by LAMPS/PACS at a minimum support price from farmers
- 7.5 lakh MT paddy procured by 681 LAMPS/PACS from 1.39 lakh farmers in 2021-22
- Procurement of minor forest produce at minimum support price

Providing agriculture input services

- Agriculture inputs such as fertilizer, seeds, pesticides etc are provided to the farmers
- LAMPS/ PACS are working as Custom Hiring Centres for agriculture equipments

Self-sustenance of farmers through Cooperative Federations

- 12 apex Cooperative Federations constituted at State Level which are working in the field of minor forest produce, vegetables, fisheries, lac production, weavers, milk production etc
- Online and Offline marketing of lac-based products through Kusum Emporium
- JHAMFCOFED is benefitting **25,000** tribal families directly and over **1** lakh MFP Collectors indirectly through State schemes
- Promotion of MFP based products viz. tamarind, chironji, biju mango etc through JHAMCOFED'S Model Outlets
- Quality milk and milk products through 'Medha' with 6 milk processing units with milk collection centres in 18 districts of the State
- Promoting fishery through 5200 cage cultures across Jharkhand
- Established 22 retail outlets for sales and promotion of fruits and vegetables by VEGFED

- 19 cold storages (5000 MT) established across Jharkhand
- 139 cold rooms of 30 MT established
- 32 solar based mini cold rooms established

New initiatives – alleviating the vagaries of crop loss

Crop assurance farmers through Jharkhand Rajya Fasal Rahat Yojna (JRFRY) without any premium



Both 'Raiyat' & 'Bataidaar' farmers are eligible to apply



Both Kharif (Paddy & Maize) and Rabi (Wheat, Mustard, Gram and Potato) season crops are covered in the scheme



No intermediary role of insurance companies and no premium is required to be paid by applicant farmers



Assured financial assistance to eligible farmers only in the event of crop loss occurred due to natural calamity



In event of 30-50% loss: Rs. 3000/ acre max. upto 5 acres In event of >50% loss: Rs. 4000/ acre max. upto 5 acres (Loss estimation through data of Crop Cutting Experiment)

- Inter-state exposure visits of LAMPS/ PACS and field officials for cross learning
- Provisioning thematic/ issue-based trainings LAMPS/ PACS and Cooperative Societies
- Infrastructure such as warehouse, offices, vehicles etc may be provisioned through Central sector integrated scheme on agricultural cooperation
- Priority to Cooperatives in Centrally Sponsored Schemes for local employment creation
- Policies on interest subvention, human resources development, capacity building etc
- Cooperative specific Export Policy
- Support for organizing National/ State Level Cooperative Conclaves
- Support for organizing District Level 'Sahkarita Sammelan'
- Promoting cooperative products through common product branding for cooperatives
- Promoting online marketing portal
- Organizing buyers-sellers meet
