नई सहकारिता नीति बनने से देश में सहकारी आंदोलन मजबूत होगा : शाह

नई दिल्ली, (पंजाब केसरी) : केन्द्र सरकार ने मंगलवार को लोकसभा में बताया कि नई राष्ट्रीय सहकारिता नीति बनाने के लिए एक राष्ट्रीय स्तर की समिति बनाई गयी है और इस नीति से 'सहकार से समृद्धि' की सरकार की परिकल्पना को साकार करने में मदद मिलेगी तथा देश में सहकारी आंदोलन सशक्त होगा। केन्द्रीय सहकारिता मंत्री अमित शाह ने लोकसभा में बीज जनता दल के अच्युतानंद सामंत के एक प्रश्न के लिखित उत्तर में यह जानकारी दी। उन्होंने कहा, ''नयी राष्ट्रीय सहकारिता नीति बनाने के लिए गत दो सितंबर, 2022 को सुरेश प्रभू की अध्यक्षता में एक राष्ट्रीय स्तर की समिति का गठन किया गया है जिसमें सहकारी क्षेत्र के विशेषज्ञों, राष्ट्रीय, राज्य, जिला, प्राथमिक स्तर की सहकारी समितियों के प्रतिनिधियों,



राज्यों के सचिव (सहकारिता) और सहकारी समितियों के पंजीयकों. केंद्रीय मंत्रालयों एवं विभागों के अधिकारियों को शामिल किया गया है।'' शाह ने अपने उत्तर में कहा, ''नई राष्ट्रीय सहकारी नीति बनने से 'सहकार से समृद्धि' की परिकल्पना को साकार करने में मदद मिलेगी, देश में सहकारी आंदोलन सशक्त होगा और इसकी पहंच जमीनी स्तर तक होगी।" उन्होंने कहा कि नयी नीति का प्रारूप बनाने के लिए यह समिति प्रतिक्रियाओं, सुझावों और सिफारिशों की समीक्षा करेगी।

गौरतलब है कि केंद्रीय गृह एवं सहकारिता मंत्री अमित शाह ने गत वर्ष सितम्बर में घोषणा की थी कि पैक्स से ऊपर की सहकारी संस्थाओं के लिए एक समग्र दृष्टिकोण बनाने के लिए जल्द ही एक राष्ट्रीय सहकारिता नीति तैयार की जाएगी। मौजूदा राष्ट्रीय सहकारिता नीति, सहकारी समितियों के चहुंमुखी विकास और उन्हें आवश्यक सहयोग देने, प्रोत्साहित करने और सहायता प्रदान करने के उदुदेश्य से वर्ष 2002 में लागू की गई थी ताकि यह सुनिश्चित किया जा सके कि सहकारी समितियां एक स्वायत्त, आत्मनिर्भर और लोकतांत्रिक रूप से प्रबंधित संस्थाओं के तौर पर कार्य कर सकें जो अपने सदस्यों के प्रति उत्तरदायी हों और राष्ट्रीय अर्थव्यवस्था में महत्वपूर्ण योगदान कर सकें।
