DCCB Vizag posts robust growth, net profit jumps

The District Co-operative Central Bank (DCCB) Ltd., Visakhapatnam, reported a strong financial performance for the fiscal year ending March 31, 2026, driven by a diversified lending approach and improved asset quality.

In an exclusive interview with *The Hindu* on Tuesday, K. Tata Rao, who assumed charge as the Person-in-Charge (Chairman) of the bank on June 2, 2025, attributed the success to the institution's commitment to financial inclusion and digital expansion.

"We have seen a robust growth of 18.74% in our total business, which rose to ₹2,849.78 crore," Mr. Tata Rao said.

"More importantly, our net profit surged by 82.65%, reaching ₹3.58

crore, reflecting our focused efforts on prudent credit management and operational efficiency."

Future target

Looking ahead, he expressed optimism about the bank's momentum, setting a clear present financial target of reaching ₹3,500 crore in total business.

A standout feature in the bank's performance has been the significant improvement in asset quality. The Gross Non-Performing Assets (NPA) amount declined by 10.43% to ₹49.81 crore, with the Gross NPA ratio improving from 3.94% to 2.92%.

Mr. Tata highlighted that the bank's loan portfolio expanded by 20.68% to ₹1,704.56 crore.

Focus on SHGs

"Our strategy to diversify lending has paid off, with gold loans witnessing an exceptional growth of 39.55%, and Self Help Group (SHG) financing rising by 29.02%," he noted.

To bridge the banking gap, especially in rural and agency areas, the bank has aggressively pushed its digital infrastructure.

Currently, the institution operates 32 branches and has deployed 19 ATMs, supplemented by five mo-

bile ATM vans—funded through NABARD's Financial Inclusion Fund—to serve unbanked villages across Visakhapatnam, Anakapalli, and the Alluri Sitharama Raju (ASR) districts.

"Our digital literacy campaigns and the expansion of services like UPI, mobile banking, and RuPay debit cards are essential to our mission of providing secure banking to all classes of people," Mr. Tata added.

The bank, is affiliated to 420 societies—including primary agricultural, fishermen, and weaver cooperatives—also prioritised social security for its members by facilitating life and accidental insurance schemes.

"With a CRAR of 9.42%, we are well-positioned to continue supporting the agricultural and cooperative sectors in the region," he added.



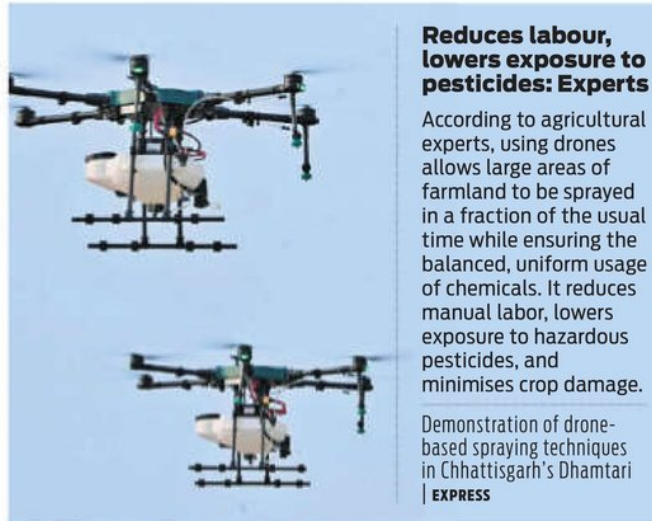
Co-op societies using drone sprayers for yields

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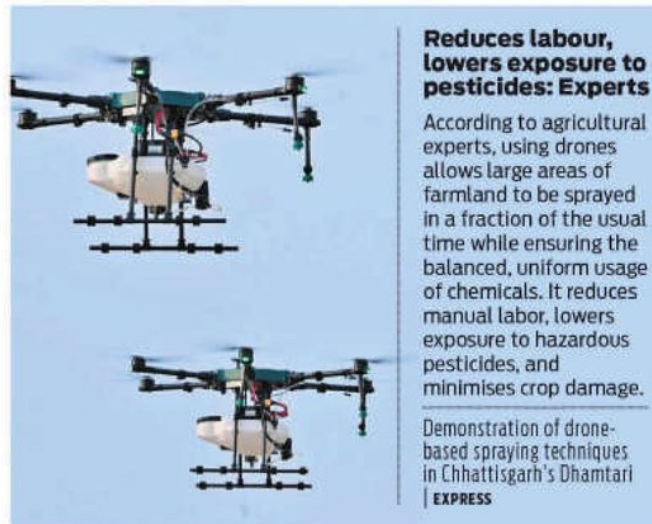
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Govt ups crop loan limit, brings more varieties under credit net

Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann on Tuesday announced enhancement in the short-term crop loan limits offered through cooperative banks under the Kisan Credit Card (KCC) scheme. The move involves increasing the scale of finance for several crops and bringing new crops under the ambit of institutional credit to support agricultural diversification and improve farmers' access to affordable loans.

The government has now included nine new crops for which the finance can be availed from banks under the KCC Scheme. However, the scale of finance for paddy, which is now being sown, had not been increased. Instead, the government has allowed paddy growers to avail an additional loan of Rs 2,000 per acre, for crop residue management.

Sharing details, the CM said the revised scale of finance would cover rabi and kharif crops, as well as allied agricultural activities such as dairy farming, fisheries, beekeeping and mushroom cultivation.

Other than the nine new crops, 35 varieties of vegetables under the crop loan scheme have also been included.

Mann also announced concessions for defaulting farmers associated with rural cooperative societies and

said the measures would not impose any additional financial burden on cooperative banks. He said instructions had been issued to private banks against selling mortgaged assets of farmers in case the loan turned non-performing asset. "They can look at other means to recover loans by reducing rates of interest," he said.

Encouraging farmers to open accounts with cooperative banks, the CM said these institutions offered loans at one of the lowest interest rates (around 7 per cent). He further announced an end to the prac-

Sharing details, the CM said the revised scale of finance would cover rabi and kharif crops, as well as allied agricultural activities such as dairy farming, fisheries, beekeeping and mushroom cultivation.

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No intention to hike retail prices: Mother Dairy Chairman

Mother Dairy, which hiked milk prices by ₹2 per litre last month, on Tuesday said there is no "intention" currently to further increase the retail price in view of comfortable supply situation.

Mother Dairy, one of the leading fresh milk suppliers in India, sells around 55 lakh litre of milk per day across many States.

On May 14, the company increased consumer prices of its liquid milk variants by ₹2 per litre to partly offset rising input costs.

At a press conference, Mother Dairy Chairman Meenesh Shah said the company increased milk prices last month after a gap of one year because of the increased input cost.

About any plans to increase rates further, he said, "I do not foresee any increase. But then if there is any increase in input cost and we are in a situation where we are unable to meet our ends, we will see."

"But, as of now, we have no intention to increase the consumer price," said Shah, who is also the Chairman of National Dairy Development Board (NDDB). Mother Dairy is a wholly owned subsidiary of the NDDB.

He asserted that the milk supply situation and procurement of milk from farmers in the country are comfortable now.

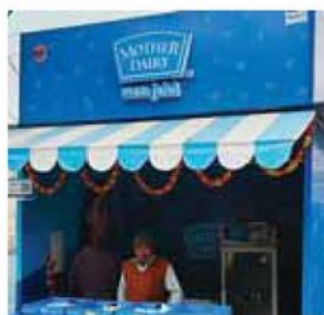

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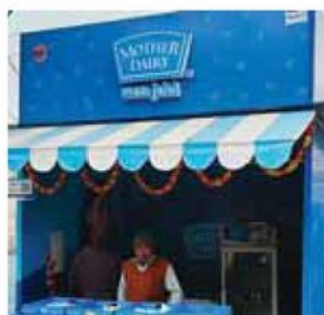

Mother Dairy, which hiked milk prices by ₹2 per litre last month, on Tuesday said there is no "intention" currently to further increase the retail price in view of comfortable supply situation.

Mother Dairy, one of the leading fresh milk suppliers in India, sells around 55 lakh litre of milk per day across many States.

On May 14, the company increased consumer prices of its liquid milk variants by ₹2 per litre to partly offset rising input costs.

At a press conference, Mother Dairy Chairman Meenesh Shah said the company increased milk prices last month after a gap of one year because of the increased input cost.

About any plans to increase rates further, he said, "I do not foresee any increase. But then if there is any increase in input cost and we are in a situation where we are unable to meet our ends, we will see."

"But, as of now, we have no intention to increase the consumer price," said Shah, who is also the Chairman of National Dairy Development Board (NDDB). Mother Dairy is a wholly owned subsidiary of the NDDB.

He asserted that the milk supply situation and procurement of milk from farmers in the country are comfortable now.

On concerns related to supply of



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Shah said the Government has taken various measures to boost milk production through improvement of animal health and their productivity. More dairy cooperative societies are being formed across the country.

Last month, Mother Dairy had said the "revision in prices has been necessitated in view of the sustained increase in farmer procurement prices, of around 6 per cent over the past one year, despite continued efforts to limit the impact on consumers".

Mother Dairy had said the price revision represents only a partial pass through of increased costs. It passes on nearly 75-80 per cent of its milk sales realisation to farmers.

No plan to raise milk prices for now: NDDB

THE POSSIBLE IMPACT of weak monsoon on green fodder supplies may not affect milk production, and prices are unlikely to rise above current levels, Meenesh Shah, chairman of the National Dairy Development Board (NDDB), said on Tuesday.

“In terms of the India Meteorological Department’s forecast of below-normal monsoon rainfall, we will be able to manage with cattle feed and dry fodder, we do not see any challenge as it (shortfall in monsoon rains) would not impact the entire country,” Shah told FE.

He said there may be some issues in central India, but fodder supplies in the northern and southern regions are comfortable.

“Compared to last year, we are paying more to the producers or farmers because of an increase in inputs, which we have already factored in; as of now we have no intention to increase the price,” Shah said.

In May 2025 and 2026, milk prices were hiked by cooperatives such as Amul and Mother Dairy by ₹2/litre for various variants due to a rise in input costs and the geopolitical situation.

In the last decade, Shah said that milk production in India, the world’s largest producer over the last two decades, has been growing at



a compound annual growth rate (CAGR) of 5% to 6%. “Both in terms of production and procurement, we are witnessing a healthy growth and there is no de-growth except for a few years during Covid,” Shah stated.

“Both growth in production and consumption are moving in tandem; that’s why we are not facing any challenge in terms of supplies and production,” he said. India’s milk production was 247.87 million tonne in 2024-25, an increase of 3.58% year-on-year.

Shah noted that the country is currently comfortable in terms of milk production and for the next 10-15 years, NDDB does not foresee consumption growth being higher than production.

However, he acknowledged that the biggest current challenge is the lower productivity of animals currently around 2,200 kg of milk per animal per lactation against the global average of over 10,000 kg of milk per lactation.

A key decision taken in the meeting is the introduction of a fully online allocation system for milk cooperatives and collection centres. The new digital mechanism is aimed at ensuring transparency in the allotment process and reducing manual intervention in administrative procedures. Officials said the move is expected to streamline operations and improve accountability across the dairy supply chain. In another significant policy reform, the minister approved a provision allowing local milk committees to install Bulk Milk Coolers (BMCs) using their own financial resources.

The initiative is intended to improve milk preservation at the village level, reduce spoilage and enhance quality before procurement by dairy unions.

The meeting also reviewed and approved the rollout of several completed infrastructure projects across the state. These include a large-scale milk processing unit at Jaipur Dairy with a capacity of 1 million litres per day, which is expected to significantly boost processing efficiency and meet growing urban demand.

Other projects include a 50,000-litre processing plant in Rajsamand and new cattle feed production facilities in Pali and Gulabpura with capacities of 300 tonnes per day and 150 tonnes per day respectively. Officials also discussed

plans for setting up an additional 150-tonne cattle feed plant in Kota to further strengthen livestock nutrition infrastructure.

Minister Kumawat emphasized the need for timely implementation of all pending works and directed officials to immediately clear outstanding payments owed to livestock farmers. He stated that any delay in farmer payments would not be tolerated, underscoring the government's commitment to safeguarding the interests of rural dairy producers.

He further stressed that strengthening Rajasthan's dairy ecosystem is crucial for supporting rural livelihoods, improving milk quality standards and ensuring long-term sustainability of the cooperative sector.

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Punjab hikes kisan credit card crop loan limits to assist farmers

CHANDIGARH: Punjab Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann on Tuesday announced a major policy overhaul for Kisan Credit Card (KCC) holders, significantly increasing the cooperative loan limits for various traditional crops and adding new ones to encourage agricultural diversification across the state.

Addressing the media, Mann detailed the revised credit limits, highlighting that the loan ceiling for the wheat crop has been raised from Rs 24,300 to Rs 30,000 per acre. In a first-of-its-kind initiative, the state government will also provide a loan of Rs 2,000 per acre specifically earmarked for crop residue management.

Furthermore, the loan

limit for sugarcane farmers has seen a substantial jump, increasing from Rs 44,000 per acre to Rs 1 lakh per acre.

As part of the state's push toward crop diversification, several new crops have been integrated into the KCC scheme with dedicated loan structures. Farmers will now be eligible for loans of Rs 1.57 lakh per acre for garlic, Rs 92,686 per acre for the Rabi onion crop, and Rs 80,981 per acre for hybrid tomatoes.

The scheme also extends

to lemon grass at Rs 30,000 per acre, 'jamun' at Rs 23,000 per acre, bamboo at Rs 13,000 per acre, and poplar farming at Rs 2,000 per acre. For fruit growers, a loan of Rs 47,000 per acre will be provided for cultivating dragon fruit.

The allied agricultural sectors have also received financial boosts under the new policy. In fisheries, the standard loan limit has been enhanced from Rs 2.50 lakh to Rs 3 lakh per hectare, while the credit limit for white shrimp farming has been increased from Rs 4.50 lakh to Rs 5.50 lakh per hectare. Concluding his address, Chief Minister Mann emphasised that these revisions would simultaneously help improve the financial health of the state's cooperative banks, which currently claim to offer the lowest interest rate in Punjab at 7 per cent.

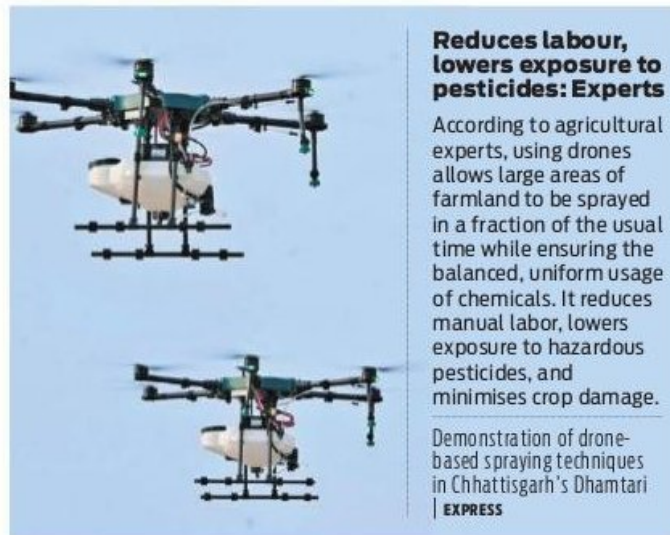
Co-op societies using drone sprayers for yields

चौथे ग्रेड की प्याज की कीमतों को लेकर बवाल कीमतें सामान्य बनाए रखने के लिए नाफेड कर रहा प्याज की खरीदी

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■ **मुंबई:** महाराष्ट्र की सियासत में कांटे यानी प्याज की कीमतों को लेकर बवाल मचा है। कहा जा रहा है कि किसान एक से डेढ़ रुपये प्रति किलो प्याज बेचने को मजबूर हैं। लासलगांव और नासिक के प्याज कारोबारियों ने कहा कि प्याज की सबसे निम्न ग्रेड यानी डी ग्रेड की प्याज की कीमतों को लेकर किसानों में असंतोष है। इसका असर पूरे प्याज मार्केट पर पड़ रहा है। दूसरी ओर प्याज की गिरती कीमतों के लिए किसान विचौलियों को जिम्मेदार ठहरा रहे हैं।

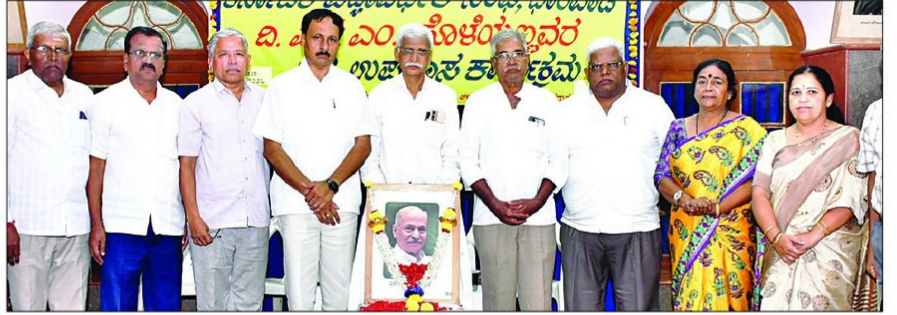

The Telangana government is formulating a new cooperative policy, aligning with the Central Government's 2025 National Cooperative Policy, to introduce e-governance, online services, and digital registrations. The policy aims to enhance transparency, simplify transactions, and establish cooperative clubs in educational institutions, along with a new cooperative academy for training. A draft is being prepared after departmental consultations and a high-level meeting, with its release expected soon after government approval.



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State to frame guidelines for cooperative taxi apps: CM

Mumbai: The Maharashtra govt will soon frame guidelines and permit app-based cooperative taxi aggregator services, chief minister Devendra Fadnavis said on Tuesday, describing the initiative as a step towards providing economic stability and social security to lakhs of drivers.

The announcement was made at a meeting chaired by Fadnavis at the state secretariat Mantralaya to review the launch of services by Sahakar Taxi Co-operative Limited, also known as Bharat Taxi. It is an initiative conceived under the guidance of Union Home and Cooperation Minister Amit Shah with the aim of empowering nearly two crore commercial drivers across the country. Built on the principle of Sarathi Hi Malik (the driver is the owner), drivers can become stakeholders in the cooperative by investing in the scheme.

The platform operates on a zero-commission and surge-free model, offering fares that can be up to 30% cheaper for riders while ensuring maximum profits go directly to the drivers. Fadnavis said the new taxi model will bring social security as well as economic stability to drivers. It will also provide quality service to commuters. TNN
